

PROGRAM INFORMATION

- What is Learn to Surf?: A program for kids ages 9-17 hosted by the City of Los Angeles Aquatics Division designed to teach participants how to surf. No prior experience is required but participants will need to pass a swim evaluation to continue with the program.
- Where will the program take place?: The site for the program will vary depending on the session you sign up for.

 Monday-Friday sessions will primarily be at Venice Beach, however the first day will be at Cabrillo Beach. Monday,

 Wednesday, Friday sessions will take place at Cabrillo Beach.
- What will the program consist of?: The first day will consist of some basic body movements to teach participants how to pop up, paddle & how to sit on the board on the Cabrillo's *Inner Beach*. After the first day, participants will receive ongoing instruction regarding surf fundamentals and safety tips as beachgoers.
- How will they get to the beach?: Transportation is an option if needed and will only be offered at the registration site.

 There will be no adjustments to where we will be picking up or dropping off each session. Parents may also drive participants themselves. Parking passes/discounts are not available.
- Do they need their own equipment?: No, we will be providing equipment to use daily.

 Please note that program parameters are subject to change in response to staffing shortages and limited availability of equipment

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

What are the registration requirements?:

- 100 Yards continuous freestyle
 - Evaluation must be completed at an LA City Recreation & Parks
 Swimming Pool.
 - Must be completed by the Thursday before the start of the session.

Proof of evaluation will be requested for all participants.

Repeat participants registered as of Spring 2023 will not be required to resubmit an evaluation sheet.

Please note that onsite staff may determine that it is unsafe for your child to continue in the program on our first day.

Beach Water Quality Advisories

Beach Closures

A beach is closed anytime there is a known sewage or chemical spill impacting ocean waters. Water contact may cause someone to become ill. When a beach is closed, the Department of Public Health advises beach users to avoid all contact with ocean water in the closure area and where closure signs are posted.

Ocean Water Quality Rain Advisory

A rain advisory is issued when there is significant rainfall that may cause bacteria levels in ocean waters to increase. Bacteria levels can increase significantly during and after rainstorms, as contaminants within the runoff enters the ocean. Bacteria levels may remain elevated up to 3 days depending upon the intensity of the rain and the volume of runoff. Elevated bacteria levels in ocean water may cause illness, especially in children and the elderly. The Department of Public Health recommends that beach users avoid contact with ocean water for a period of 3 days after significant rainfall, especially near flowing storm drains, creeks and rivers.

An Ocean Water Quality Rain Advisory has been declared for all Los Angeles County beaches. The advisory will be in effect at least until 9:00 am, Saturday, April 1, 2023 (72 hours after significant rainfall). Beach users should avoid water contact for at least 72 hours after significant rainfall. This advisory may be extended depending on further rainfall.



- Meeting Location:
 - @ Cabrillo Beach will be on the sand in between the Cabrillo Beach Bath House & The Bluff Tower.
 - @ Venice Beach will be near Tower 19 located near Pickleball Courts off of Venice Blvd
 - Blue Learn to Surf Shade Canopies will be up as the visual marker to look for
- Additional staff will be on site to monitor the group when they are not in the water & to assist/chaperone participants when walking to & from the bathroom.



While at the Beach Continued

Parking @ Cabrillo Beach:

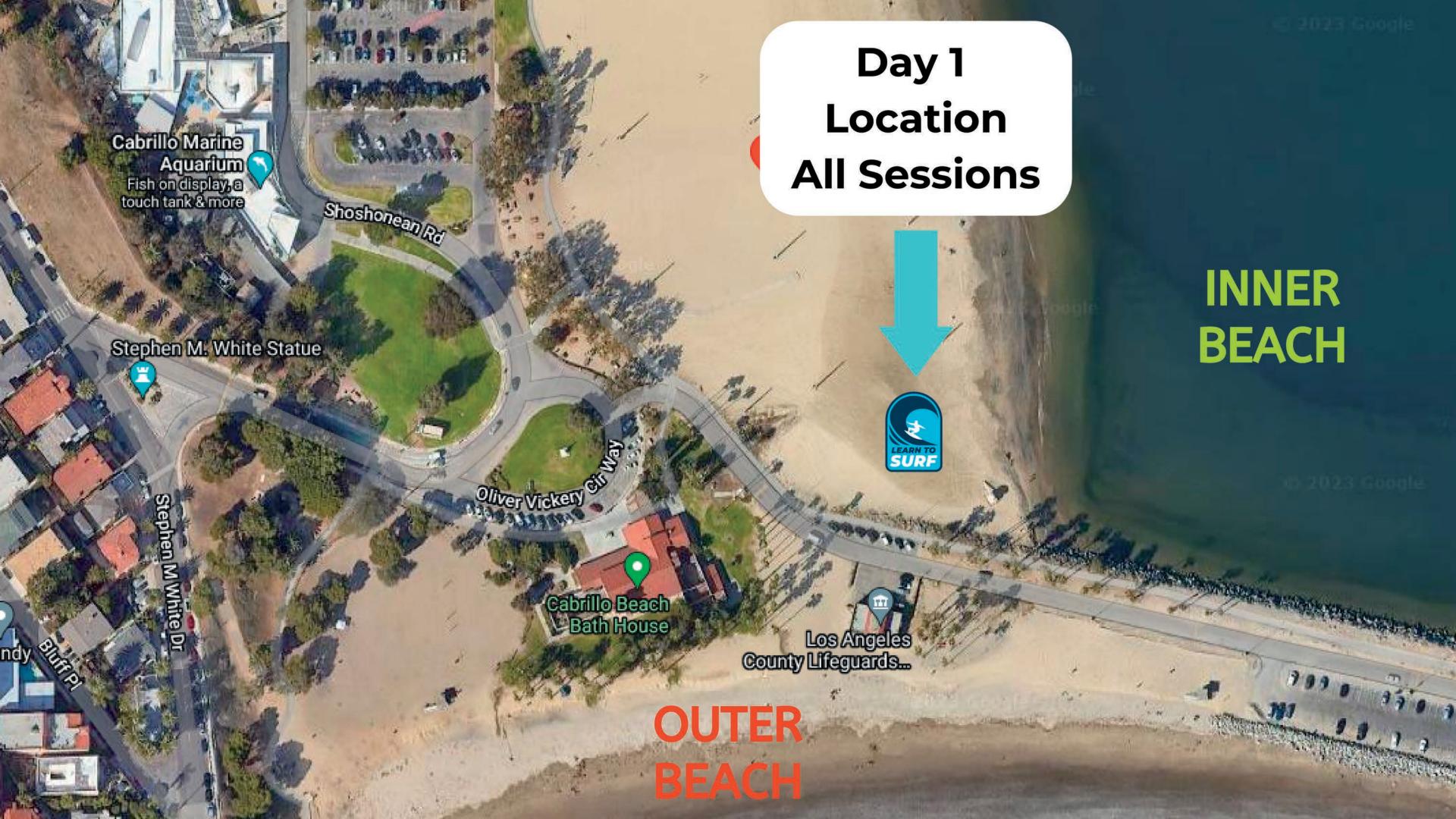
- \$9 for the day due at the entrance of the parking lot if staying for the duration of the class.
 - Pass available for drop off/pickup upon request. Good for 15 minutes
 - Park Rangers Patrol parking throughout the day.

Parking @ Venice Beach:

- Parking lot operated by Beaches & Harbors. We do not have the ability to offer passes/discounts for parking.
- Parking prices vary upon the time of entry and can be as high as \$20

Pets:

- Pets are not allowed on either side.
- More strictly enforced on the Inner Beach











Mandatory Paperwork

The following must be submitted on the first day of *Learn* to *Surf* prior to leaving the pickup site.

- Camp Registration Form
- Parent Agreement for Field Trip
- Parental Consent for Teen Camper Self Check Out
 - For participants 13+ Only
 - NO EXCEPTIONS

Parent Responsibilities

- It is the parents' responsibility to submit all required documents, adhere to the sign-in/sign/out procedures.
- Participants will not be allowed to participate without submission of all paperwork & information entered online via *Google form*
 - The form will be sent out and must be filled out prior to the start of the 1st day.
 - 1 submission per participant
 - Submission of paper copies will still be required on the first day.

Parent Responsibilities - Check-In/Out Procedure

- Only authorized relatives are allowed to check-in and check-out the child
- Authorized relatives: parent/guardian and any other relative the parent/guardian has authorized to pick up their child
 - Making additions to the authorized pick up list after the initial submission will only be approved if done in person & vetted through the program coordinator.

Requirements for Check-In

- Child must be walked all the way to the check-in station
- Proof of ID (no exceptions)
- Full signature

Requirements for Check-Out

- The child will only be released to authorized parent/guardian and authorized persons
- Proof of ID (no exceptions)
- Parental Consent for Teen Camper Self Check Out
 - 13 years and older only. No exceptions

Non-Custodial Parent

- o Allowed, unless a copy of a current restraining order is on file at the facility
- The happiness of the child is of utmost importance and we ask all divorced or separated couples agree to review and abide by the policies

Early pick-up

- Please call Citywide Aquatics (323-906-7953) to arrange for early pickup.
- Note that early pickup will require pickup on site @ the beach.

Parent Responsibilities - Participation and Dress Code

Participation

- Participants are expected to participate in all activities
- Please encourage your child to participate in the activities that are being provided throughout the day
- Activities have been planned that is catered to all age groups and specific age groups

Dress Code

- Learn to Surf T-Shirt at all times (mandatory once distributed)
 - Will be distributed on Day 1 (please fill out Google Form!)
- Appropriate swim attire swimsuit/jammers

Parent Responsibilities - Participation and Dress Code



A Google Form will be sent out to everyone via email to input uniform sizes.

Entries for each session must be submitted by the Thursday prior to the start of session.

Participants who already received a uniform in prior sessions will not receive additional uniforms throughout ongoing sessions.

Parent Responsibilities - What to Bring

- We highly recommend packing the following items for participants to bring:
 - Sandals
 - Rash guards/swim shirt
 - Wetsuits highly recommended but will be available on site
 - Booties for feet (useful for Cabrillo)
 - Appropriate swim attire swimsuit/jammers
 - Towels
 - Sunblock
 - Additional clothes and towel
 - Extra bag to carry their wet clothes
 - Water
 - Snacks/Lunch

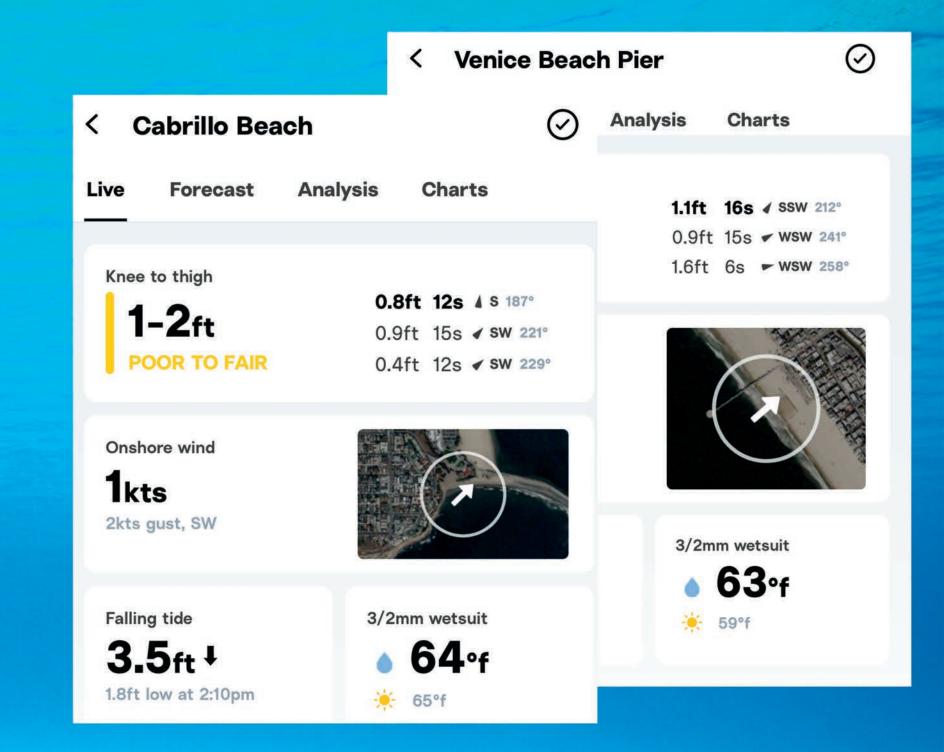


Water Temp & Booties

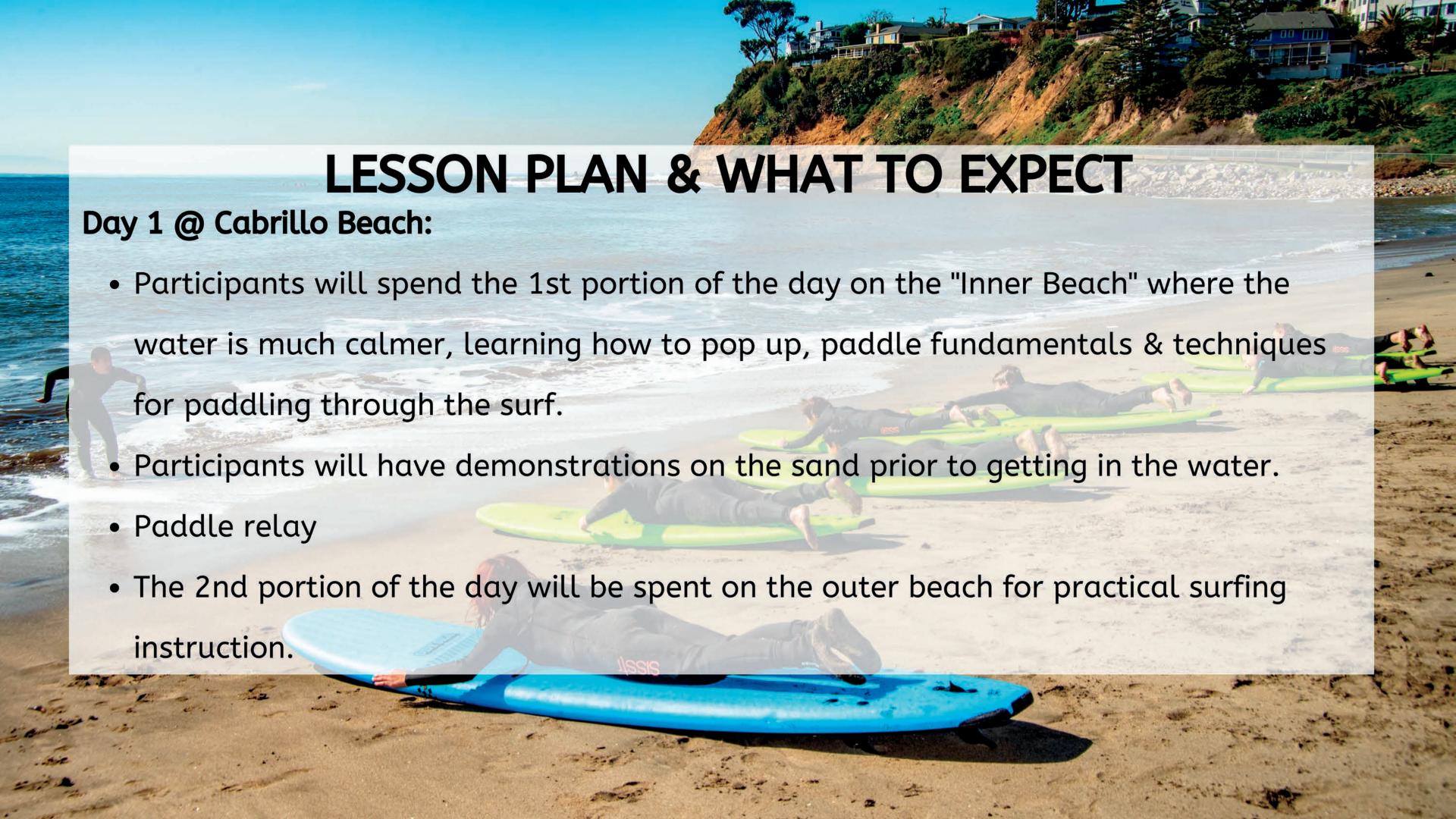
Parent Responsibilities - Lunch

- Lunch will NOT be provided
- Participants will not be allowed to leave the facility/beach to buy food.
 - NO EXCEPTIONS
- Child is recommended to bring enough food/snacks/water for the day

PARTICIPANT GUIDELINES

- Each child is expected to follow directions and participate in all activities
- Child is not allowed to leave the group or area at any time with the exception of the following:
 - Early pick-up by an authorized person
- ZERO tolerance for the following:
 - Bullying, hazing, profanity, physical violence
 - We encourage that you speak to your child about respecting those in the camp as well as staff
 - We encourage you to let your child know to speak up if they feel like they are experiencing a form of bullying, hazing, etc. OR if they are witnessing such behavior







LESSON PLAN & WHAT TO EXPECT

Participants will do a variation of the following daily while at the beach:

- Surf Check
- Bottom Check
- Stretch Routine
- Body Surfing (learn how to play in the waves safely)
- Body Boarding/Boogie Boarding
- Paddling
- White Water surfing
- Identify Hazards in & out of the water

Learn To Surf Overview - Camp Guidelines

- All personal belongings that are left will be placed in the lost and found bin
- Please encourage your child to keep all belongings in one place and refrain bringing anything of value
- Phone calls
 - Cell phones may be utilized for emergency purposes only
 - Everything should be stored in their bag

Illness, Emergency Medication

Illness/Injuries

- We encourage you to keep the child at home if they are experiencing symptoms of the common cold and/or Covid-19
 - They will not be able to enter upon screening if experiencing symptoms
 - If the child exhibits Covid-19 symptoms, we will notify you immediately and the child must get picked up immediately
 - o If your child is injured on site, we will immediately notify you
